Established in 1966, the Welfare Council has provided a wide range of social services, from caring for infants and toddlers to supporting the elderly, from promoting physical and mental health to offering rehabilitation care, from community support to residential care, from life education to end-of-life care, from social work intervention to interdisciplinary team collaboration. Additionally, we provide food assistance, community living room, and transitional housing to grassroots families. The Welfare Council currently operates over 200 service units and member agencies across Hong Kong, Macau, and Guangzhou, creating a comprehensive and close-knit service network. We offer personalised services and holistic care to those in need, helping them to "transform life, live in abundance".

Mission and Vision

The Providence Garden for Rehab (PGR), adheres to the motto "Individual Caring, Overall Concern" of Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Welfare Council, provides innovative and diversified services for about 1000 persons in mental recovery and mentally handicapped persons since 2006. It aims at enhancing their living standard and achieving the integration of these persons into community life.







Build up Normalized Way of Life

PGR emphasizes the concept of normalization through the empowerment model in which members share their rights and responsibilities to lead an independent life. Meanwhile, the comfortable residence design and greenery outskirt of PGR building creates home-like environment for the members. The family based and community based principle emphasizes to help members to have harmony family life and integrate into the community.

Advocate Body-Mind-Spiritual Integration Model

PGR is based on the concept of comprehensive rehabilitation to advocate body-mind-spiritual development. With diversified services and creative arts to practice the body-mind-spiritual holistic health so as to bring enjoyable and healthy life for members.

Professional Team

PGR is the first largest-scale comprehensive rehabilitation services complex in HK with 13 storeys in height. There is over 400 staff from multidiscipline, including nurses, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, art therapist, pharmacist, speech therapist, social workers, etc. They work hand in hand to excel their professional knowledge and skills to provide quality services and living for members and their families.

Integrated Service

There are different services to provide members with a diverse range of residential, day training and community services.

Mental Health Enrichment Service

Long Stay Care Home

To provide long stay hostel service for members. Through educational, developmental training and therapy to enhance the self-care skills and community living skills for the members.

Halfway House

To help persons in mental recovery go back to the community by providing them a transitional hostel service and rehabilitation service for improving their interpersonal relationship, social skills, self-care and work abilities.

Talent Enrichment Service

Hostel and Day Activity Centre for Severely Mentally Handicapped Persons

Hostel for Moderately Mentally Handicapped Persons

To provide hostel and life coaching services for mentally handicapped persons of different levels.

Care and Attention Home for Severely Disabled Persons Day Care Service for Persons with Severe Disabilities

To provide hostel and comprehensive caring services to people with severely physically handicapped through different therapeutic and developmental activities.

Vocational Development Service

Integrated Vocational Rehabilitation Service Centre

To provide one-stop integrated and seamless vocational rehabilitation services for persons with disabilities. It aims to enhance their work skills, develop their social and economic potential, and prepare them for potential advancement to open employment.

Supported Employment Training for Persons with Disabilities

To provide persons with disabilities who are capable of self-care with employment counseling, work skills training, job attachment and job trial services, in order to enhance their adaptation to employment and increase employer's confidence in employing persons with disabilities.
